# Ardross Primary Rag Bag Fundraising - Textile Recycling Raise £400 per tonne for your school.



Ardross Primary is participating in the Rag Bag Textile recycling scheme which provides regular fundraising for our school and raises awareness about recycling. There are two outdoor clothes banks located in the playground for you to drop off donations in a securely tied plastic bag for collection as soon as possible so we don't lose this help. #### ARDROSS COMMUNITY COUNCIL....NEWS

#### ARDROSS COMMUNITY COUNCIL MEETINGS

The new Ardross Community Council has now had its inaugural meeting and chosen the Office Bearers until the next AGM in June 2024. Peter Allen is Chair, Emma Chisholm is Vice-Chair, Alison Gordon is Treasurer and John Edmondson is Secretary. As well as the elected representatives, the Ardross Primary School Parent Council are an Associate Member. The Community Council has one vacancy at the moment.

OfGEM are currently undertaking a consultation at the moment into standing charges. Standing charges in the Highlands are some of the highest in the UK, and high standing charges hit the poorest the most. Details are on our website as to how to respond.

We responded to the consultation on the Morangie Forest Plan.

We are still waiting to hear from the Access Officer regarding the newly installed padlocked gate on the Core Path around Loch Dubh. The original gate has been removed and the new gate does not allow access as required for instance for buggies and horses. The car park sign has been removed as well and this was required as a Planning Condition for the Distillery. We want to ensure that all users can use the Core Path and will keep pursuing this. Unfortunately it is not unusual for Council Officers not to respond, and it is becoming increasingly common.

We have previously reported that the Ardross Mobile Post Office has had issues connecting to the Ardross broadband network to undertake various transactions. It is still unresolved. This is solely down to the inefficiencies of the Post Office; apparently an ethernet cable is a "special procurement", it is genuinely exasperating and we will keep you updated on Facebook.

There is a common theme emerging if you read through this Newsletter entry; and that is that it is almost impossible to get any information at all out of the Highland Council at the moment. With the Highland Council increasingly being unable or unwilling to co-operate our job as a Community Council becomes a lot harder.

#### ROADS

You can report pot holes using the Highland Council website, but it is cumbersome and seems to be designed to discourage reporting. There is an alternative way of reporting these potholes which is a lot easier <a href="https://www.fillthathole.org.uk/hazards/report">https://www.fillthathole.org.uk/hazards/report</a> and seems to get results. So if you come across a pothole that you think needs repairing please report it. Remember once a pothole has been reported the Highland Council becomes liable for any damage to vehicles caused by these potholes, after a reasonable time.

Over the Christmas holiday period there have been a spate of accidents on the B9176 Struie Road. The majority of these have occurred just beyond the snow gates at Strathy and a significant number on the Stittenham bends. We wrote to the Highland Council as early as 2022 about the section at Strathy which was part of the over layering. We have asked for it to be surface dressed which is what was done at Newbridge and although starting to wear has been a distinct improvement. Repair and/or replacement of the barriers at Stittenham bends have been marked as a priority by the Highland Council, although as of yet nothing has happened.

The Community Council are seeking improvements to the Dalnavie cross-roads to improve the junction safety, in particular making it a safer place for pedestrians. The Ardross Community Council for a long time have wanted to lower the speed limit to 40mph here. The Highland Council have produced a Report on recommendations for improving the road safety at Dalnavie cross-roads, but have ignored our Freedom of Information Request to

produce it, it is looking likely that we will have to make an appeal to the Information Commissioner to get the Highland Council to release the information. Without knowing what plans if any the Highland Council have, then getting a solution for the road safety at the cross-roads gets harder.

#### **ELECTRICITY PAYMENTS**

The Ardross Community Council have extended the eligibility for the electricity payments to households with anybody over the age of 65 years. There are more details elsewhere in the Newsletter. #### PLANNING, WINDFARMS & PYLONS

#### Windfarms

It is our understanding that EnergieKontor will start construction on the Strath Rory wind farm this quarter.

#### **Pylons**

SSEN have announced their preferred routes for a large new pylon line running from Beauly to Spittal. More details came out in December and SSEN have chosen the route that goes through Strathrusdale skirting around the bottom of the Novar wind farm. It should be noted that neither OfGEM or SSEN have still not demonstrated that there is a need for these pylons, indeed OfGEM have indicated that they will finally determine any need, after the planning process has finished.

#### Plannina

A further public information event was held for the Cromarty Hydrogen Project close to the Aultnamain. The issue of closed snow gates preventing delivery of the hydrogen has yet to be resolved. The huge amount of water required is supposed to be coming from a new water mains laid from Newmore, which will be disruptive. The water could be obtained via a bore hole at the site, which could have implications for local private water supplies.

The first battery storage plant near the Alness substation has been approved.

#### COMMUNITY BENEFIT

#### Recent Grants and getting an Award

The Community Council funds the Newsletter and makes a regular annual payment to the Ardross Primary School for organised trips. We also fund electricity payments to eligible households.



## Looking back at the Archives Ardross Community Newsletter "The voice of the Community"

The Ardross Community Newsletter was first published in May 1997 and was produced by Iain Black with the help of Alison Gordon. There was already a newsletter produced by the pupils of Ardross Primary school in June & December called the "Ardross Parrot" so in order to avoid clashing with this publication it was agreed the community newsletter would be produced in October & March.

We thought you might be interested in some of the news that featured in the newsletter all those years ago. So here are some extracts from Easter 2002. (Anyone with old editions of the newsletter from 1999 to 2002 please get in touch).

#### Old Hall News

The old hall is being bought by Highland Council Education Department and will be turned into an extension for the Primary School. The proceeds from the sale, £20,000 less legal costs, will be paid to the hall.

#### Ardross Community Council Meeting 11 February 2002

The weekly postbus has been withdrawn from the Ardross run.

There had been a meeting with the Roads Transport Manager of Highland Council to discuss having Direction/Indication signs mounted on existing road sign supporting poles and for the Council to try and remedy the flood problems at the Hall and school.

The replacement trees for the avenue had been planted on 9th February 2002, those planted by the school children appeared to be coming on the quickest.

#### Ardross Church

The second half of the church floor has been replaced thanks to a grant from Awards for All and a generous donation from Mr John McTaggart, Ardross Castle.

#### Other groups

A good way to meet others in Ardross was to come along to the Ardross Lunch Club which meets on the  $1^{\rm st}$  Wednesday of the month.

Ardross Nursery & Playgroup were looking for more volunteers and help with fundraising.

The Ardross Youth Club was looking for helpers, funding and ideas for activities to do with the young people of Ardross.

Frank McConnel's Ceilidh dance classes were very successful with lots of folk having a great time learning new dances as well as some of the old favourites.

There were plays and dances and an Indian Scottish Fusion night on at the hall and planning was in place for a special retirement party being held at the Hall in June for Mrs Shona Gray who was a primary school teacher at Ardross Primary for many, many, many years.
